

QUICK GUIDE TO STREAMING THE FESTIVAL

WATCHING THE FILMS

Watching on a laptop/PC (super easy!)

After purchasing your ticket, you will be sent a viewing link for your film via email (each film will have its own separate email and viewing link). If you can't find it check your 'junk mail'.

Around the start time of the film, open the corresponding email and click the 'Play' button.


This will open a new tab where the event will start.

Watching through a TV

You can also stream your films through your TV if you have any of the following services:

Google Chromecast, Apple TV, Android TV, Amazon Fire TV

You may also be able to connect your laptop to your TV! See Page 2 for instructions!

Don't worry if you're a bit late to the film - it will only start when you press play! You will have 24 hours from the film's scheduled start time to watch the film, so you can pause the film (and get your second cocktail out the fridge!) if you like. This applies whether watching on laptop or through a TV.


WATCHING THE SPEAKER EVENTS

We're excited that three of this year's films (The Mauritanian, The Father and Ammonite) will be accompanied by guest speaker events. These will be broadcast through the Bridport Arts Centre's YouTube account and you will be able to access them after you've finished the film.

If you have purchased a ticket for a film with a speaker event, then before the film starts you will be sent an email containing a link to the speaker event.

When the film finishes you can go this email and click the link.

Alternately, simply go to the [Bridport Art Centre's YouTube Channel](#) and click on the relevant video, though remember the video won't start until its scheduled start time (see pic opposite!)

OPTIONAL: CONNECTING YOUR LAPTOP TO A TELEVISION (VIA HDMI)

If don't have Google Chromecast, Apple TV, Android TV or Amazon Fire TV you may still be able to enjoy the films through your TV if you connect your lapto to your TV via a HDMI lead.

Warning: this does require a few more steps and the right hardware so make sure you test it out before the day of the film!

Before starting you will need:

1. A laptop and television with a HDMI input

Most televisions have HDMI inputs. Unfortunately, not all laptops do (especially slim ones) but many do!

2. A standard HDMI Cable

Many DVD players use these. You should also be able to buy them at any computer shop/ online



Step 1

Get your film set up and ready on your laptop (see page 1)

Step 2

Connect your HDMI lead to your laptop and your TV

Step 3

Select 'source' on your TV and find HDMI 1 and click on that channel.

Note: your TV may have multiple ports so it may also be HDMI 2, HDMI 3 or HDMI 4

Step 4

Your TV should now display your laptop screen and you should be able to enjoy your film on the big(ger) screen.
